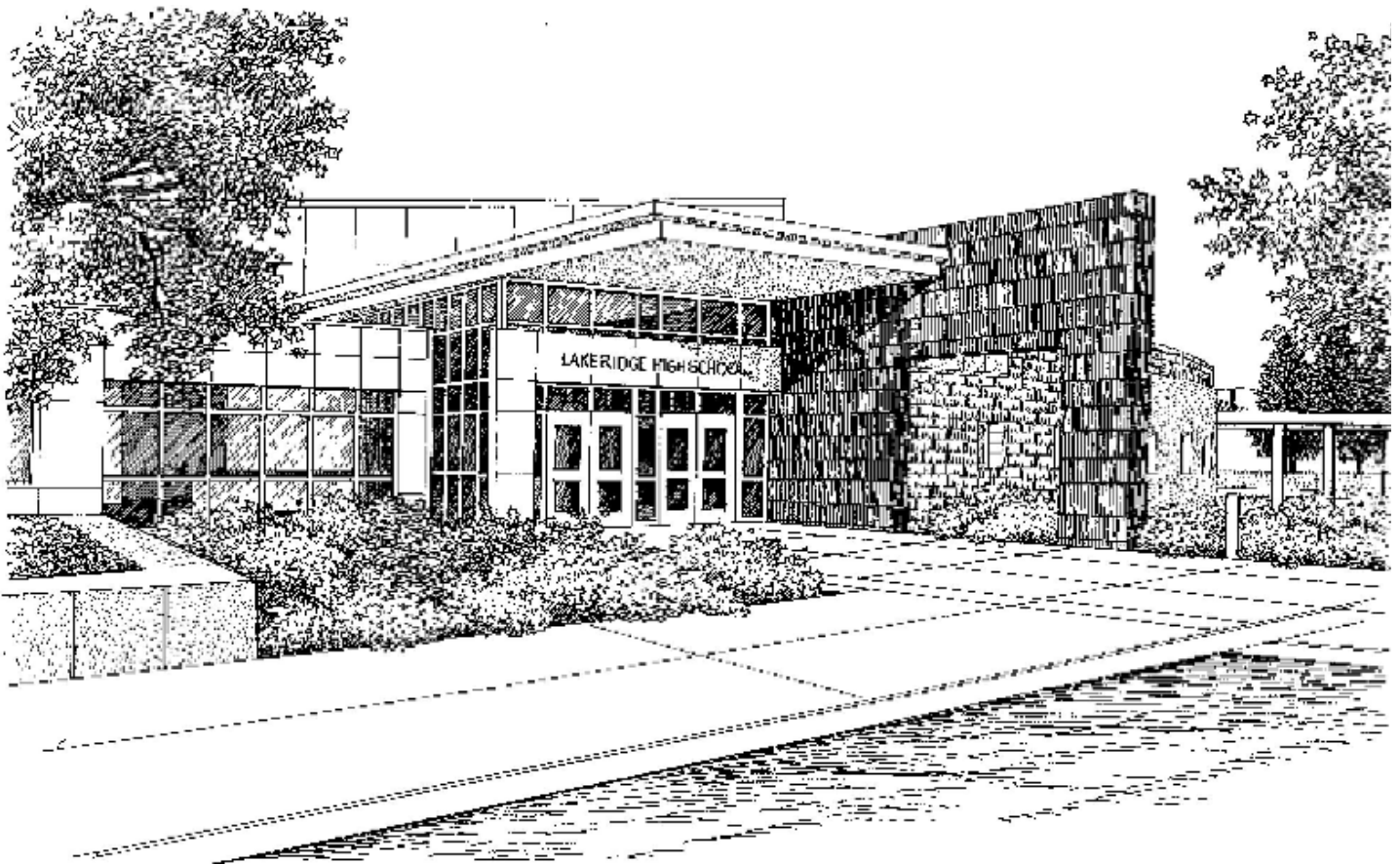

The Community

Lake Oswego is a suburban residential area eight miles from Portland, Oregon with a population of approximately 34,000. It is comprised primarily of business and professional people. The community demonstrates strong support of academic achievement through cooperative alliances with the school district.

The School

Lakeridge High School is a four-year comprehensive public secondary school, which offers a challenging course of study aimed at meeting the needs of a predominately college-bound student body. Lakeridge is accredited through the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges. An alternating day schedule with four 90-minute classes daily is offered to all students. Extensive student activity programs include athletics, drama, music, dance, speech, clubs, and student government.

Of the 67 faculty members, 61 hold a Masters degree and two hold a Doctoral degree. Student enrollment is approximately 1,100 students.

Graduation Requirements

The Lake Oswego School District requires a minimum of 25 credits for graduation in the following areas:

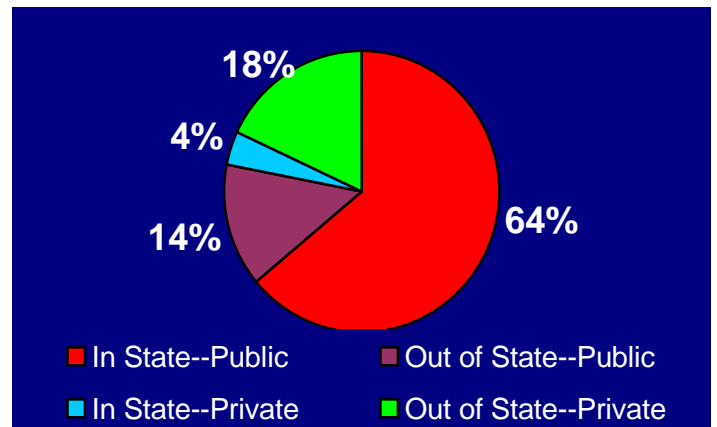

Weighted Rank Order

Lakeridge computes two separate class rankings for seniors. One is based on the cumulative grade point average. The other is based on a weighted system applied to the GPA. This rank recognizes the intellectual rigor inherent in advanced placement and accelerated courses. Weighted rank order is not denoted on the transcript; however, a weighted rank order is reported to colleges at the request of the student.

College Attendance

Of the 266 Lakeridge graduates, 91.9% reported that they planned to enroll in a 4 year or 2 year college.
